

Full-Time Student Recertification by February 3



Whether your full-time student is returning to campus or enrolled online, remember to recertify their status with the MTA Business Service Center (BSC).

Do you have a dependent enrolled in college this spring semester?

If your eligible dependent is a full-time student over the age of 19, remember to recertify their student status by February 3 to retain dental and/or vision and dependent life insurance benefits under your MTA insurance plan.

Here's What You Need to Do

If you already submitted a full-time student verification for the fall 2022 semester, just log on to My MTA Portal at www.mymta.info. Click on the **My Benefits** ribbon, then click on the **Student Recertification** link and follow the instructions to recertify for spring 2023. You do not need to send in documentation when using this method.

Documentation *is* required if you are certifying your dependent's student status for the first time, or if your dependent was previously removed from your dental, vision, or life insurance coverage. You must submit certification to the BSC by Feb 3 by email or fax at 212-852-8700.

Certification requires a copy of the student's schedule, a statement from the school, or [National Student Clearinghouse](#) verification with the accredited institution's name and indicating full-time student status or credits for the Spring 2023 semester.

About Student Eligibility

The Affordable Care Act (ACA) ensures that your eligible dependent child can remain on your medical plan until age 26. However, the ACA does *not* address dental, vision, and life insurance plans. Based on your agency and title, your child may be eligible to continue MTA dental and/or vision and life insurance coverage beyond age 19, provided the child is enrolled full time at an accredited institution.
